No Internet connection at home? Canyons District schools offer free WiFi, which can be accessed from school parking lots. Many local businesses and organizations also have stepped up to assist families who lack high-speed Internet access at home.

School Parking Lots	WiFi should be accessible from all CSD school building parking lots. Park as close to the building as possible.	Contact your school's principal with specific questions.

Smartphone WiFi Hotspots	Right now, many mobile phone providers have suspended data limits, giving customers access to unlimited data on their cell phones. This means smartphones can be turned into mobile hotspots to give Internet access for up to 2-3 devices at a time.	Contact your mobile phone provider to verify data limit and hotspot options.
